



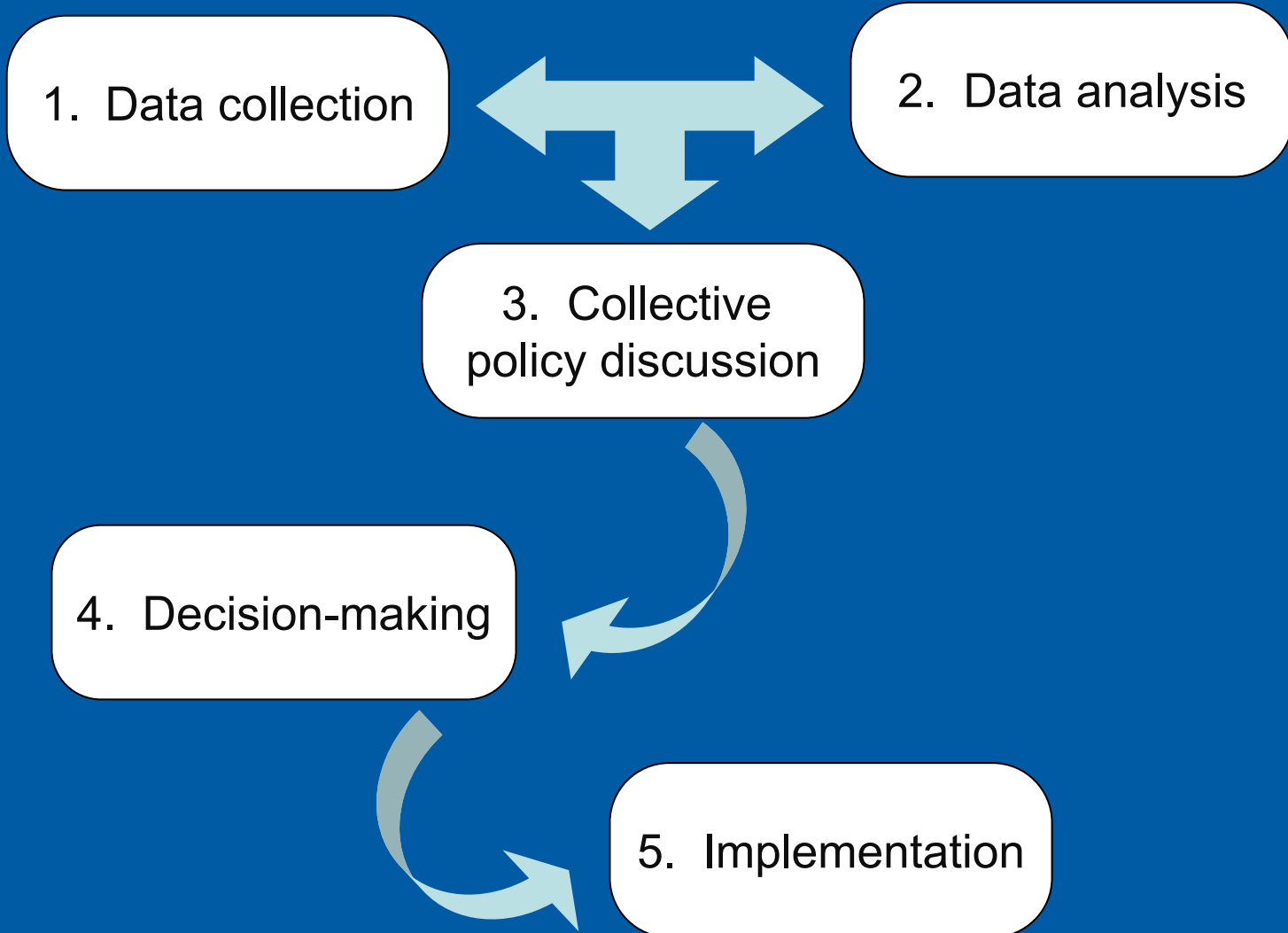

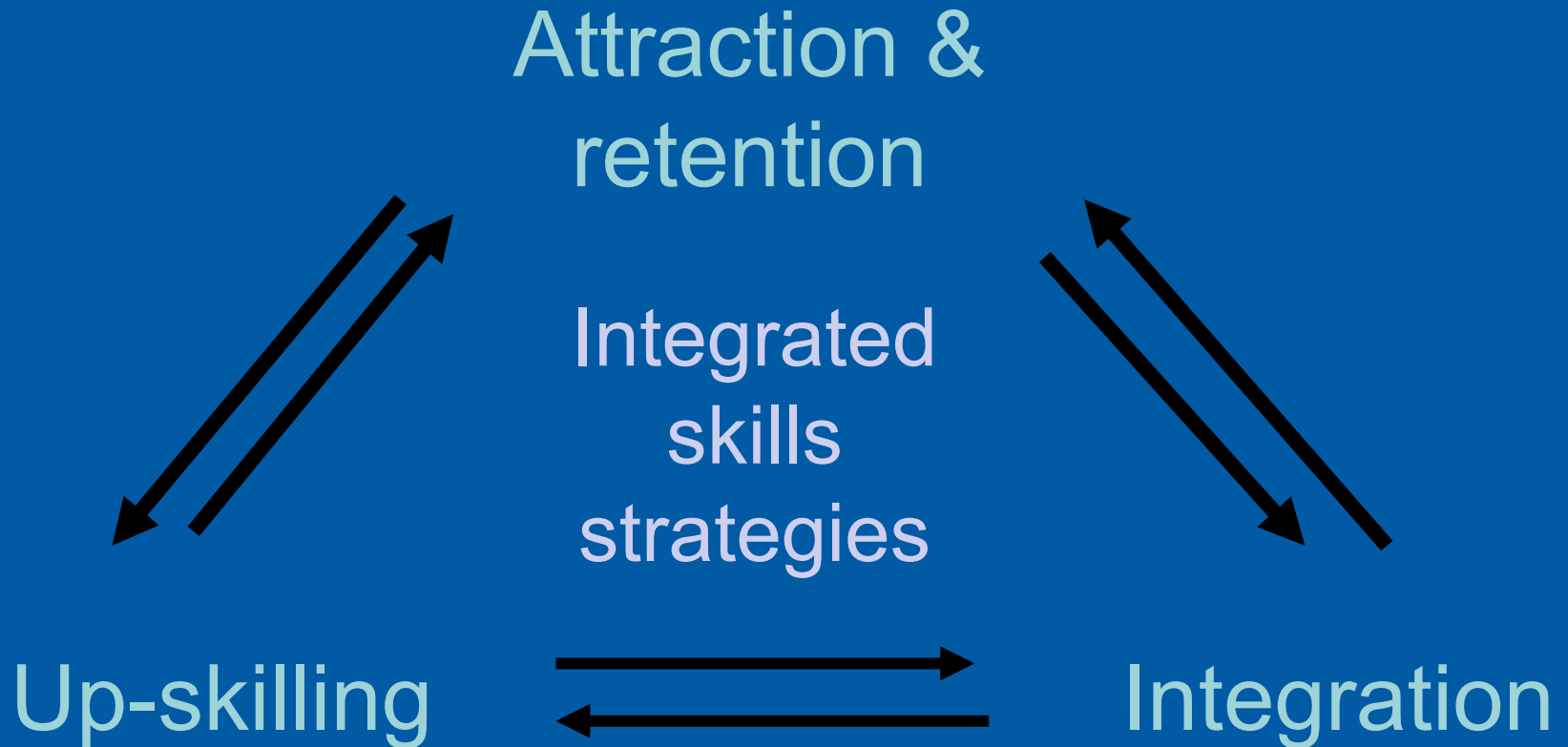

 - Grow Wisconsin Initiative (USA)

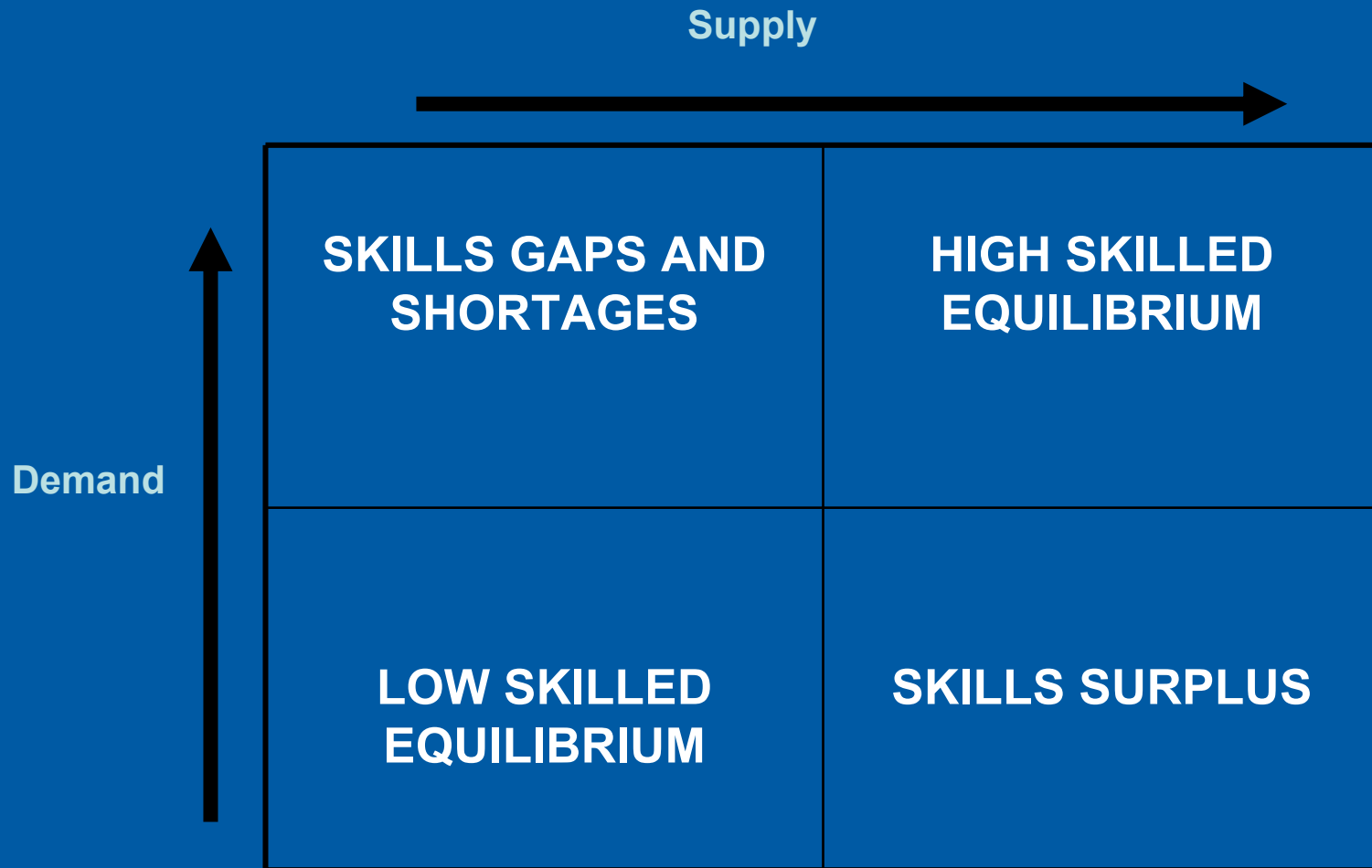


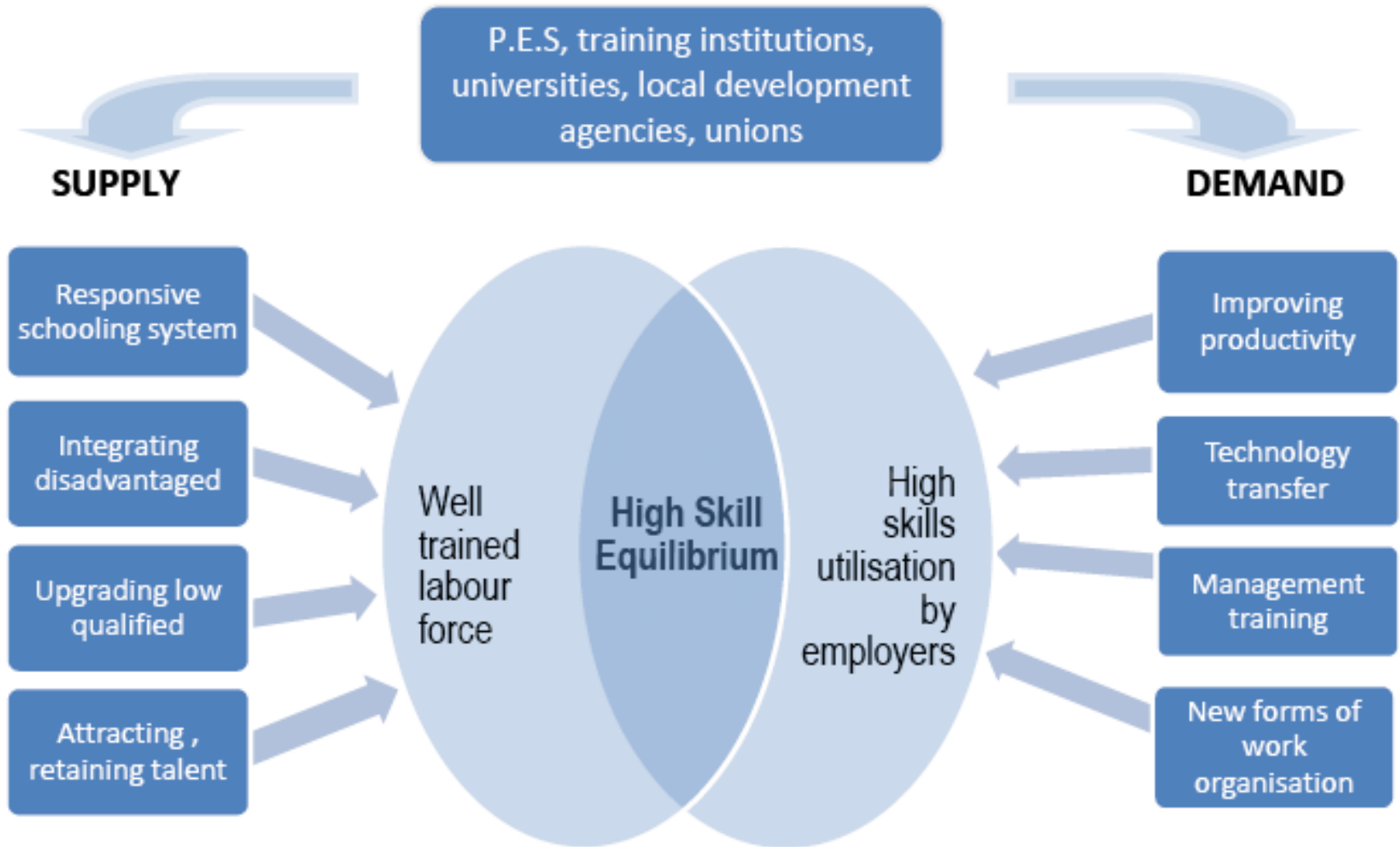
Ensure human capital for economic development

- Local economic development is focusing on human resources and skills as much as on infrastructure or FDI



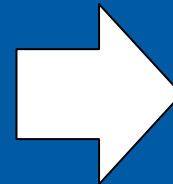
Local variation
